A public meeting was held Tuesday, March 26, 2024 where Council and the public heard a presentation on applications to amend the Official Plan Amendment, Zoning By-law, and Plan of Subdivision from Agent Scatliff + Miller + Murray seeking to redesignate the property at 301 and 325 Nelson Street; N Mill Complex PC, from Light Industrial to a Mixed-Use, and further to subdivide this land into several parcels. The purpose for these applications is to permit the potential future development of a mixed-use "Wellness Precinct".

This is in partnership with Aazhogan of Rainy River First Nations, and is Phase I of BMI's plans for the former mill redevelopment which overall will include market, gateway, waterfront, and enterprise.

The Phase I plan presented incorporates its proximity to La Verendrye Hospital into its planning, and plans to build a large clinic/health centre, with lodging for visiting health professionals. There will also be space for hotel and retail.

## RESPONDING TO YOUR CONCERNS BUDGETARY DECISIONS



Administration and Council faced challenges as uncontrollable costs skyrocketed in 2024. Decisions made brought down the increase to residents from over 7% to 5.54%. Where able, Council and Administration try to avoid increases. Keeping taxes down aids in attracting new residents, tourists, and economic development, which benefits all of us.

#### CONCERNS HEARD ABOUT SENIOR CENTRE LUNCH PRICES & MAKING MEMBERSHIP FEES

Council asked for ideas where savings or revenues could be found in specific areas of the organization, including the Seniors Centre. Raises in pricing of lunches and creating memberships and fees were just a couple of many potential options brought forward for discussion. There has been no direction to make membership fees at this time however this initiative may be reintroduced in the future. Lunch fees may increase, but not to the amounts proposed. Recommendations to pricing increases are always published in our agenda. #### **CONCERNS HEARD TO MAKING CUTS TO THE LIBRARY BUDGET**

The Library requested a 5% budget increase for 2024. Due to concerns about a significant tax increase for residents and cuts in many Town departments, the full 5% was not granted. Council recognized the importance of libraries as well as the contributions our Library provides to our community and did implement an increase. The Library's budget was not cut; rather, the increase was reduced to lessen the tax burden. ## THE SOLAR ECLIPSE

**ABOUT THE ECLIPSE** 

INFORMATION PROVIDED IS QUOTED AND ADAPTED FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF ONTARIO APRIL 8, 2024 TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE SAFETY SHEET

April 8th, 2024, after 1pm CDT to approximately 2:20 CDT as the moon aligns perfectly between Earth and the Sun, parts of Ontario will experience temporary darkness.

## **DID YOU KNOW**

- It's not safe to look at the Sun without eye protection. Looking at even a small sliver before or after the eclipse without eye protection can be harmful to your vision. Health impacts may include retinal burns, blurred vision, and loss of eyesight (immediate or delayed onset).
- Glasses with specialized filters adhering to the ISA 12312-2 international standard can be worn to
  prevent eye damage. Glasses should be inspected for wrinkles or scratches ahead of use and should not
  be used if damaged.
- If eye protection isn't available, try alternative viewing strategies, like an eclipse box or live stream.

## TRAVEL TIPS

- While driving, avoid looking at the eclipse. Keep your eyes on the road to drive safe & avoid collisions.
- Follow local directives and road signage as you travel on April 8. While travelling on highways, do not stop, take pictures, or get out of your car to view the eclipse.
- Stay updated on road conditions before, during, and after the eclipse by visiting 511on.ca
- Expect increases in traffic and road congestion. Plan ahead, fill your gas tank, and have snacks, water, entertainment, & first-aid supplies on hand.
- If travelling to view the eclipse, plan to arrive at your destination 24 to 48 hours head of time.

## **DID YOU KNOW**



## **HAZARDOUS WASTE**

The Town runs a hazardous waste collection day the 2nd Saturday of September.

**Did you know** that the Town is reimbursed by Product Care Ontario for items such as light bulbs, paint and pesticides? These reimbursements help offset the cost of the event.

## **BATTERIES**

**Did you know** that alkaline batteries (A, AA, C, D cell, etc) can be dropped off at public works at no cost for safe recycling by Call2Recycle?

### **GLASS**

**Did you know** that since November 2023, recyclables do not have to be separated and glass is accepted in your blue boxes along with other recyclable materials?

As well, glass can now be disposed of in the recycling compactor on 6th Street West with your other recyclables.

## **FLUSHING**

**Did you know** the following items should not be flushed: pharmaceuticals, personal hygiene products, household hazardous waste, fats, oils, grease.

Sewage lift stations need to be cleaned on an annual basis, with the Town spending approximately \$50,000 to clean out items that should not have been flushed.
